Who is Confluence Health

- Confluence is the 6-year-old affiliation of the Wenatchee Valley Medical Center and Central Washington Hospital.
 - Wenatchee Valley Medical Center, now Wenatchee Valley Medical Group, is a Multispecialty Medical Group serving the region of North Central Washington State since 1940. Now 300 Physicians, 140 APPs.
 - Central Washington Hospital is a 183-bed Tertiary Care, full service hospital. It is the only tertiary hospital in the 12,000 square mile area providing many core services.
 - Confluence is a not-for-profit organization with a commitment to regional service, excellent quality and clinical stewardship.
 - ▶ The CEO is a Physician
 - Dyadic leadership structure, involving Physicians and non-Physician leaders at every level of the organization.

Our service area



The challenge: patients with a problem that no one wants to deal with. Not problem patients.

- Basic tenants
 - These are people with problems, not problem people.
 - ► This is everyone's responsibility.
 - ▶ No ones panel is "closed" to these patients.
 - Specialists are available for consultation but not to "take over care".
 - ▶ We will use "Multimodal therapy" as a foundation of our treatment.
 - Behavioral Health is embedded within Primary Care. (open access model)
 - Activity based therapy recommended and tracked.
 - ► MAT prescribers available throughout Primary Care.

Opioid Care Committee

A multidisciplinary team available for consultation to any provider for any patient requiring opioid or MAT therapies.

- Physicians, Pharmacists, APPs, Nursing.
- Act to give advice on specific patients.
- Stay up to date with current literature and provide education system wide.
- Maintain and monitor opioid and combo drug dashboard.
 - Currently reporting on MED>90 or dangerous combinations.
 - ► Dashboards directed to providers, with patient specific data.

Drug take back program

- Secure drug take back boxes available at all major Clinic and Hospital Sites
 - These boxes provide anonymous disposal of any medication (free) for all patients or family members.
 - Community education programs explaining the risks to youth of having "extra" medication at home.
 - So far, greater than 2400 lbs. of medication has been returned for disposal.
